

Priority at junctions:

Right turn (major road to minor road)

Normally the traffic on the major road has priority. Some drivers may not give cyclists priority – you need to be aware of traffic all around you and should try to make eye contact with drivers to make sure they have seen you.

Take a look at the diagram below: Cyclist **A** wants to turn right from a major road to a minor road. Number the 8 steps in the circles below into the correct sequential order from 1-8.

| <input type="radio"/> Put both hands back on handlebars. | <input type="radio"/> Give a lifesaver look back. |
| <input type="radio"/> Look back as you approach the junction. | <input type="radio"/> If there is traffic coming you need to stop and wait opposite the junction. |
| <input type="radio"/> If it's clear ahead, you should make the turn when you are opposite the junction – aiming for the left hand side of the lane and trying not to cut the corner. | <input type="radio"/> Reset the pedal and then follow the iCycle System when the road ahead is clear. |
| <input type="radio"/> Check ahead for any oncoming traffic. | <input type="radio"/> If it's safe, signal clearly with the right arm – hold the signal and move out towards the centre line. |
